Hot summer weather leads to lazy days spent poolside. Consider the following to stay "Pool Safe":

- Is the fence at least 1.2m high?
- Are there no gaps greater than 100mm in the fencing?
- Do gates open outwards?
- Do gates automatically shut?
- Are gate latches self-locking?
- Do you have top bolts on ranch sliders that may prevent access to the pool?
- Steps for para-type pools are removed when the pool is not in use?
- Does the pool surround have a non-slip surface?
- Is there a first aid kit available?
- Are pool chemicals stored safely?
- Do you have signage for emergencies?
